On Monday, October 18, the fifth season of THE SHAKESPEARE PLAYS will begin on public television with a new production of KING LEAR, starring Michael Hordern and directed by Dr. Jonathan Miller. No dates have been set for Cymbeline or for the Spring plays, so please check with your local PBS station for a final calendar of the season.

Since the season is divided between two semesters, and since this will be the only mailing covering these plays, your teachers will probably appreciate your keeping these materials on hand through Spring of 1983. Note that there are two sets of Teacher Response Cards and Teacher Notification Sheets, one each for each semester.
