

## Journalist Robert MacNeil Introduces His New Memoir

Until his retirement from the program in 1995, ROBERT MACNEIL was co-anchor of PBS's award-winning MACNEIL/LEHRER NEWSHOUR. He's also the author of two works of nonfiction, one of which, Wordstruck, is a narrative about his deep love for our language, and of three novels, the most recent being Breaking News. One of the most eloquent of television journalists, Mr. MacNeil is the gifted artist who brought The Story of English to our homes, and he is now at work on a sequel, Do Your Speak American? In the interim he's graced us with Looking For My Country, his account of how a native of Canada finally decided that he should become an American citizen.
