

GYLES BRANDRETH OFFERS AN INSIDER'S VANTAGE ON BRITAIN'S ROYAL COUPLE



Armed with privileged access to both Queen Elizabeth II and her husband, Prince Philip, British writer GYLES BRANDRETH presents the first major biography of an intriguing pair whose personal affairs have remained largely hidden from public view. The author has known the Duke of Edinburgh for more than twenty-five years, and the Queen for nearly that long, and has interviewed them both on several occasions. In *Philip and Elizabeth*, his *Portrait of a Royal Marriage*, Mr.

Brandreth reveals that Her Majesty and her spouse are sharply contrasting personalities who have nevertheless forged a partner-

ship that serves both them and their subjects well. Illustrated with Prince Philip's family photographs as well as with pictures from the monarch's royal collection, this engrossing book will engage a large, appreciative readership with its candor, authority, and flowing



A VICARIOUS TOUR OF BLENHEIM WITH LADY HENRIETTA SPENCER-CHURCHILL

In what should be a gathering to cherish, Lady HENRIETTA SPENCER-CHURCHILL, Sir Winston's cousin, will discuss and display highlights from her illustrated literary excursion to *The Ancestral Estate of One of England's Most Venerable Families*. As she leads us over the imposing grounds and into the ornate corridors of a palace that has long been a destination for Anglophiles, she'll examine the relationships between a monument of British heritage and the fascinating men and women who both shaped it and were in turn shaped by it. A reward from Queen Anne to the first Duke of Marlborough, Blenheim is considered by many to be the United Kingdom's

finest example of baroque architecture. It is most widely recognized, of course, as the setting for a legendary Prime Minister's



nativity. From his study there during the darkest days of World War II, an indomitable leader supervised and imparted courage to the embattled forces of a civilization whose very survival was at stake. But the home we associate with Churchill has also borne witness to a panoply of other vivid characters, among them the forebears of Princess Diana and of Consuelo Vanderbilt, an American heiress who captured British high society as Duchess of Marlborough.

HENRIETTA SPENCER-CHURCHILL runs a successful firm in London, and she is the author of *Classic Interior Design*, *Classic*



IRISH WRITER RODDY DOYLE BRINGS HIS LATEST NOVEL TO AMERICAN AUDIENCES



It has been five years since RODDY DOYLE won the hearts of readers and critics alike with Henry Smart, the fearless hero of his bestselling novel A Star Called Henry. Released to enthusiastic notices, this volume took its place on several best-of-the-year lists, among them those in the New York Times Book Review and Publishers Weekly. Like its immediate predecessor, Oh, Play That Thing is a prodigious, energetic, sexy narrative, set in Mob-infested New York and Chicago and in Oklahoma during the heyday of Louis Armstrong, with richly tex-

tured language and a number of exquisite surprises. Among Mr. Doyle's previous contributions to our pleasure are *The Commit-*

ments (a novel about a workingclass Dublin rock band that became even more endearing when Doyle's witty dialogue transferred to the silver screen in an offbeat film), The Snapper, The Van (a finalist for the 1991 Booker Prize), Paddy Clark Ha Ha (which won the prestigious


Booker award and became an international bestseller), and *The Woman Who Walked into Doors*. A Dubliner, Mr. Doyle has

written for the stage and for cinema and television and has contributed stories to such periodicals as *The New Yorker*. Copies of *Oh, Play That Thing* will be on hand for purchase and for the application of authorial graffiti.

A. N. WILSON'S SURVEY OF BRITAIN'S MISFORTUNES AFTER THE VICTORIANS

The distinguished historian whose last book, *The Victorians*, scaled the heights of the British Empire, has now completed his story of its aftermath in *After the Victorians*, a panoramic overview that takes us from the death of Queen Victoria in 1901 to the dawn of the Cold War in the early 1950s. A. N. WILSON offers riveting depictions of the savagery of World War I and of the world-altering upheaval of the Communist Revolu-

tion. He describes Britain's role in determining the destiny of the Middle East. And he casts a bright new light on World War II, showing that the United Kingdom played a central part in defeating Germany but paid a severe price for its hard-won victory. The nation would emerge from the war bankrupt and fatally weakened, sidelined from global politics, while America rose to prominence as the hegemonic world power. Among his other talents, A. N. Wilson is a prolific novelist and biographer. In the words



of William H. Pritchard, writing in the Chicago Tribune, he is "incapable of writing a dull sentence," and he appears "to have
