



Dr. Andrews met Vicky Anderson at Harvard, where both were earning Master of Arts in Teaching degrees at the Graduate School of Education. They wed in August 1966 in LaGrange, Illinois, and proceeded to Nashville, where she taught mathematics at Hillwood High School and he worked on his doctorate in English at Vanderbilt. From 1970 to 1974 they and their children, Eric (born in 1971) and Lisa (born in 1973), lived in Tallahassee, where Vicky taught math at Godby High School and John taught English at Florida State. In 1974 they moved to the Nation's Capital area, where she taught math in Virginia's Fairfax County School System and he oversaw Academic Programs at the Folger Shakespeare Library on Capitol Hill. They divorced in 1983, but have remained close, taking great pride in their children and six grandchildren.

At a Halloween party in 1993 a mutual friend introduced Dr. Andrews to Jan Denton, a gifted artist and policy analyst who grew up in Gallup and Albuquerque and has held key positions in both Sacramento and Washington.
